| Kevin Brennan        | Don Bosco Prep        | NJ           | 2018      | DB  | 5'11 | 190  | A mainstay at the FBU Camps, Brennan won the Gatorade "G" Award as camp MVP and stood out as the best player at a very talented camp. He has competitive speed with explosive quickness in addition to fluid hips and footwork. Brennan primarily plays safety and demonstrated lock-down qualities in one on one drills. He is very instinctive and was the first to almost every ball on his side of the field. He elevates the play of the entire defense. |
| Rodney Samson Jr     | Iona Prep             | NY           | 2017      | RB  | 6'1  | 200  | Samson won the camp Leadership Award in the high school group. Known as an explosive north south runner on Friday nights, Samson displayed great quickness in the open field. He also caught the ball well out of the backfield and performed exceptionally well against a very talanted group of linebackers.  |
| Jayse Bradley        | Bergen Catholic       | NJ           | 2019      | WR  | 6'2  | 170  | Bradley received an invite to the 2017 National Combine at the U.S. Army All-American Bowl. He spent the weekend making the difficult catch look easy. Bradley high points the ball extremely well and has good vertical speed. He is a developing route runner and dynamic with the ball in his hands.   |
| Sebastian Delasoudas | Don Bosco Prep        | NJ           | 2018      | OL  | 6'0  | 275  | Delasoudas received an invite to the 2017 National Combine at the U.S. Army All-American Bowl.  Another mainstay at FBU Camps, he has shown tremendous growth from last year's FBU Camp.  Delasoudas displayed good first step quickness and used his hands well to steer defenders. He has a very good upside with continued physical development.   |
| A'mon "Poke" Rolls   | Egg Harbor Township   | NJ           | 2017      | DB  | 5'7  | 150  | Rolls has good feet and he displayed the ability to flip his hips and track receivers in coverage. He was excellent defending the ball in the air.  |
| Tyron Brown          | Passaic County Tech   | NJ           | 2018      | DB  | 5'9  | 180  | Brown spent the weekend in lockdown mode. He was at his best when moving upfield to the ball. Brown had good hip flexibility and foot speed in transition.  |
| Maxwell McIntosh     | Saint Peters Prep     | NJ           | 2018      | DB  | 5'10 | 165  | McIntosh is a raw, very athletic player who was not shy to contact. He was aggressively tracking receivers in coverage and showed outstanding ball skills with good range, hands and timing.  |
| Roderic Carson       | Saint Joseph-Metuchen | NJ           | 2017      | LB  | 6'2  | 235  | A TE-DE for his school, Carson played very well at inside linebacker at camp. He also played well in forward movement while holding his own in coverage.  |
| Esaun Pinto Jr.      | Lincoln-Brooklyn      | NY           | 2017      | DL  | 6'0  | 240  | Pinto is a long, very athletic player who displayed good upfield speed off the snap. He needs to develop more variety in his pass rush but has a good upside as an ILB.   |
| Jackson Mitchell     | Ridgefield            | СТ           | 2019      | LB  | 6'1  | 178  | Mitchell is also raw, fast, and very athletic. He breaks well to the ball and is good in coverage. Mitchell needs to learn patience and trust his reads.  |
| Dante Zicarelli      | Bergen Catholic       | NJ           | 2019      | LB  | 6'0  | 210  | Zicarelli is a young, physical kid who plays with great intelligence. He is quick to diagnose and make plays. He also ran well in coverage.   |
| Azir Lawson          | Elizabeth             | NJ           | 2017      | LB  | 6'1  | 218  | Lawson continued to show the speed and quickness that also made him a top performer at last year's FBU NJ Camp. He played with improved balance and did an excellent job working his hands to cut off receivers.  |
| Erich Keutmann       | Washingtonville       | NY           | 2017      | LB  | 6'0  | 2210 | Keutmann was not the fastest or most outwardly aggressive LB in camp, but his play was efficient all weekend long. He was always in position to make a play and displayed no wasted motion.   |
| Nicholas Haydu       | Delaware Valley       | PA           | 2017      | OL  | 6'3  | 270  | Haydu is a big, physical player who displayed very good upper body playing strength. He started with a good base and displayed good first step quickness. Haydu used hands well to leverage defenders.  |
| Matt Maute           | Sparta                | NJ           | 2017      | QB  | 6'5  | 180  | Maute is a tall, lean quarterback who throws with deceptive arm strength. He did an excellent job putting balls on point at a speed and trajectory that set receivers up for success. Maute always threw on time and never missed short.  |
| Trey Dawson          | Sacred Heart          | СТ           | 2019      | QB  | 6'4  | 190  | One of the most talented players in camp was Dawson. He displayed outstanding arm strength and was poised at all times. He has a quick release and hit his spots.   |
| Matt Saleme          | Herricks              | NY           | 2017      | WR  | 6'3  | 180  | Saleme is a tall, rangy receiver who routinely made the tough catch in the air. He was precise in his cuts and one of the few receivers who could separate from coverage across the middle of the field.  |
